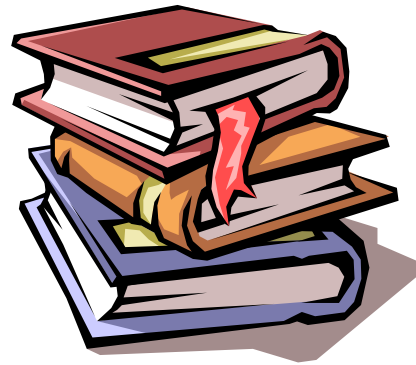


Students Speak Out...

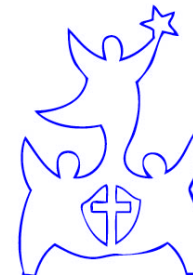
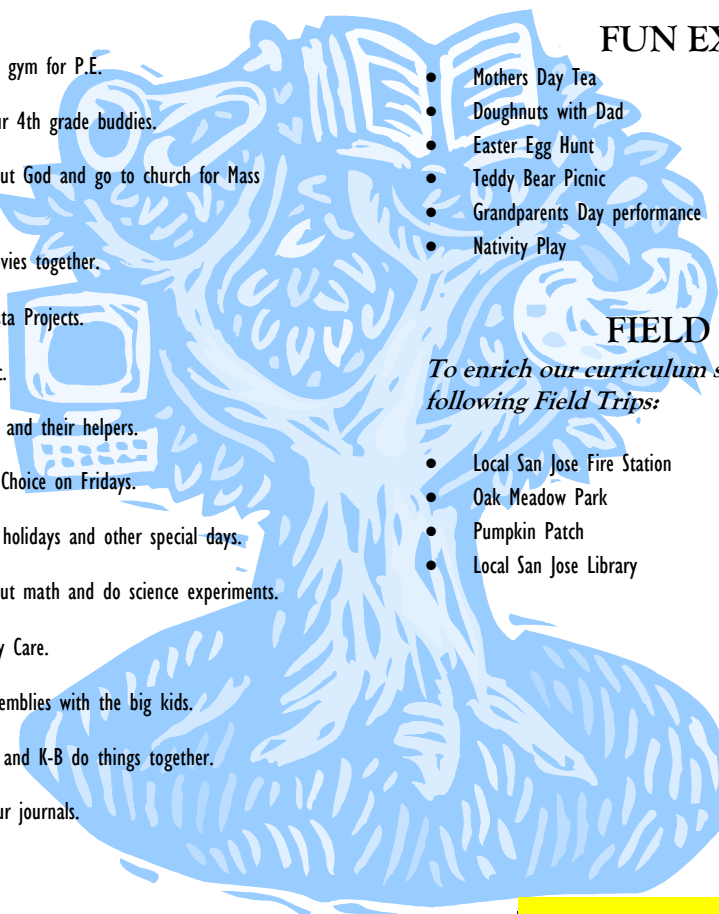

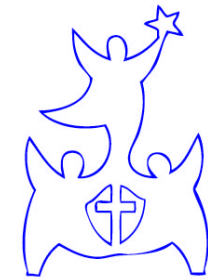
To enrich our curriculum students will participate in the following Field Trips:

Holy Family School Kindergarten offers a well-balanced program that is developmentally academic and supports the school's philosophy.

RELIGION

Students will:

- Learn that God's Love
 - Creates the Universe
 - Makes Me Who I Am
 - Gives Me People to Love
 - Gives Me Jesus
 - Teaches Me to Love
- Celebrate Seasons of the Church Year
- Experience a variety of Prayer Forms
- Listen to and retell stories from the Bible
- Participate in all-school Prayer Services and Mass
- Visit with parish priests
- Acknowledge the Holy Family as a role model for all families



SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Students will:

- Celebrate their own uniqueness
- Demonstrate respect for self and others
- Follow classroom and all-school rules
- Develop skills to work independently and cooperatively
- Become responsible citizens
- Accept consequences for their choices
- Learn to work with a Fourth Grade Buddy
- Learn to compliment and encourage their classmates

LANGUAGE ARTS

Reading

Students will:

- Recognize all capital and lower case letters
- Know the sound/letter correspondence
- Demonstrate left to right, top to bottom directionality
- Identify letters and sounds in words (initial, middle, and final)
- Recognize rhyming words and word family patterns
- Participate in reading stories, poems, songs



- Use book language (i.e. title, author, illustrator, publisher, beginning, middle and end, setting, predication)
- Take part in shared, guided and independent reading
- Read kindergarten leveled books

Writing

Students will:

- Write his or her own name with a capital and lower case letters
- Form capital and lower case letters correctly
- Draw a picture and describe it
- Participate in guided, shared and interactive writing
- Dictate ideas for the teacher to record
- Write 3 sentences on a topic using phonetic spelling
- Write in weekly journal

Listening

Students will:

- Follow a 3-step, oral instruction
- Listen attentively when the teacher reads or speaks
- Listen for content and comprehension

Speaking

Students will:

- Volunteer and share information
- Express ideas clearly
- Participate in class discussions
- Engage in a conversation
- Perform for an audience of adults and peers

MATHEMATICS

General Knowledge

Students will:

- Recognize and count numbers (0 to 100 by 1s, 5s and 10s)
- Recognize and write numbers correctly (0 to 31)
- Recognize and represent numbers up to 20
- Use manipulatives to solve problems
- Compare sets to identify which is equal to, more than, or less than
- Recognize and count ordinal numbers to 6
- Recognize odd and even numbers to 10
- Understand and describe simple addition and subtraction problems

- Identify, sort, and classify objects according to shape, size, and color
- Continue a pattern and create their own pattern (AB, ABB, ABC)
- Solve problems by making graphs

SOCIAL STUDIES

Students will:

- Pledge allegiance to and show respect for our country's flag
- Know their neighborhood and community
- Be exposed to map reading
- Demonstrate a beginning understanding of geography
- Learn about other cultures
- Celebrate holidays
- Recognize seasons and corresponding weather patterns

SCIENCE

Students will:

- Investigate
- Experiment and make observations
- Learn terminology
- Ask questions about Physical, Life and Earth sciences
- Participate in Hands-On Science

FINE ARTS

Students will:

- Have art integrated throughout the curriculum
- Participate in the all-school Art Vista Program six times a year
- Display art work at the all-school Art Faire once a year
- Have music integrated throughout the curriculum
- Participate in a formal classroom music program once a week
- Perform at the Christmas and Spring Programs for parents

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

- **Computer**
 - Children participate in 1 class per week
- **Physical Education**
 - Children participate in 2 classes per week
- **Spanish**
 - Participate in oral Spanish language development in 1 class per week.
